## LEGENDS: Local Excursions

### Generating Elderly Narratives for Digital Storytelling

#### *Project overview and key objectives*

The LEGENDS project brings together five partner organisations: Anziani e Non Solo, ARTIT, KMOP Policy Center, Institute of Development, and People Behind. The project aims to unite older adults and young people through a place-based storytelling approach that connects digital literacy with local heritage. Through local photo outings, digital storytelling activities, and the creation of an online cultural map, LEGENDS seeks to reduce older adults' digital isolation, strengthen intergenerational cooperation, and preserve cultural heritage within local communities.

#### **Its specific objectives are:**

- Enhancement of older adults' digital competences through hands-on and creative digital storytelling activities.
- Promotion of intergenerational engagement by encouraging meaningful collaboration and exchange between older adults and young people.
- Strengthening of adult educators' competences through tools and methodologies that support inclusive, participatory learning.
- Promotion of sustainability and cultural preservation by collecting, documenting, and sharing local stories, memories, and heritage through digital means.

#### *Project update*

A key milestone of the project has been the development and piloting of the first toolkit modules. Following the completion of the needs assessment phase, which exceeded the initial project targets, partners developed draft **training modules focusing on intergenerational learning, digital storytelling, urban storytelling, and facilitation techniques.** These modules were

reviewed by experts and are now being tested through national piloting workshops. The piloting phase has provided valuable feedback on the clarity, relevance, and practical use of the training content.

On May 18, 2026, the LEGENDS consortium successfully held its first virtual Transnational Project Meeting, bringing together representatives from all partner organisations to review the progress achieved so far and plan the next stages of the project. LEGENDS Facilitator's Toolkit.



#### *What's next?*

The next phase of the project will focus on the implementation of digital storytelling workshops, local excursions, and the creation of an online cultural map.

Through these activities, LEGENDS project will continue to promote digital inclusion, intergenerational cooperation, and the preservation of local cultural heritage through storytelling.
